#### Kitten news

In this, our first year as Cats' 9Lives kitten section, we have already topped the 200 mark in kitten adoptions, which considering that for at least for 2 months during winter the kitten population drops to nothing (my holiday time) this is a very good achievement. Most of our adoptions come from referrals from Vets, Pet Shops or word of mouth. At the moment, like all Animal Welfare Organisations, we are full to capacity. I could not have the success in adoptions, were it not for the wonderful volunteers, who take on the sleepdepriving job of raising tiny babies by bottle or accept the often difficult task of taking traumatised kittens into their homes to socialise. These volunteers are always willing to respond to my request to take on kittens at short notice. I'm sure that when they hear my voice, their hearts sink, but nevertheless they always help out. My grateful thanks to Peggy, Rinie, Elsa, Clarabelle, Lauren, Diane, Mariette (who made lovely cuddly blankets for the kittens) Anneliese, Jeannette and Lorraine. Thanks also to Giles for his most generous donation of Kitten Milk and dry Kitten Food. As we are feeding so many bottle babies this gift is greatly appreciated.

# News from the adults
